## Advance Report on Durable Goods Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders December 2009

#### **New Orders**

New orders for manufactured durable goods in December increased \$0.5 billion or 0.3 percent to \$167.9 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau announced today. This increase followed two consecutive monthly decreases including a 0.4 percent November decrease. Excluding transportation, new orders increased 0.9 percent. Excluding defense, new orders increased 0.3 percent.

Machinery, up three of the last four months, had the largest increase, \$1.4 billion or 6.0 percent to \$24.1 billion.

## **Shipments**

Shipments of manufactured durable goods in December, up four consecutive months, increased \$5.1 billion or 2.9 percent to \$181.9 billion. This followed a 0.8 percent November increase.

Transportation equipment, up three of the last four months, had the largest increase, \$1.9 billion or 4.3 percent to \$45.9 billion.

### **Unfilled Orders**

Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in December, down fifteen consecutive months, decreased \$8.6 billion or 1.2 percent to \$715.5 billion. This was the longest streak of consecutive monthly decreases since the series was first published on a NAICS basis in 1992 and followed a 0.7 percent November decrease.

Transportation equipment, down fourteen of the last fifteen months, had the largest decrease, \$8.6 billion or 2.1 percent to \$408.9 billion.

#### **Inventories**

Inventories of manufactured durable goods in December, down twelve consecutive months, decreased \$0.6 billion or 0.2 percent to \$302.7 billion. This followed a 0.2 percent decrease in November.

Fabricated metal products, down fourteen of the last fifteen months, had the largest decrease, \$0.4 billion or 1.0 percent to \$36.6 billion.

### **Capital Goods**

Nondefense new orders for capital goods in December decreased \$0.1 billion or 0.2 percent to \$53.7 billion. Shipments increased \$2.1 billion or 3.7 percent to \$59.6 billion. Unfilled orders decreased \$5.9 billion or 1.4 percent to \$407.9 billion. Inventories decreased \$0.6 billion or 0.4 percent to \$131.7 billion.

Defense new orders for capital goods in December decreased \$0.2 billion or 2.8 percent to \$8.1 billion. Shipments decreased \$0.1 billion or 1.2 percent to \$10.6 billion. Unfilled orders decreased \$2.5 billion or 1.9 percent to \$132.4 billion. Inventories decreased \$0.4 billion or 1.9 percent to \$19.8 billion.

## Revised November data since the January 15, 2010 Revision

Revised seasonally adjusted November figures for all manufacturing industries were: new orders, \$366.4 billion (revised from \$365.3 billion); shipments, \$375.7 billion (revised from \$374.2 billion); unfilled orders, \$724.1 billion (revised from \$724.5 billion); and total inventories, \$495.2 billion (revised from \$495.1 billion).

Not seasonally adjusted estimates of shipments and new orders include adjusted data for non-calendar reporters. Seasonally adjusted estimates include concurrent adjustments for holiday and trading-day differences, where appropriate, as well as seasonal variation, based on the results of the latest annual review of the model parameters. Estimates are not adjusted for price change:

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Based on advance sample. Estimates of manufacturers' shipments, inventories, and orders are subject to survey error and revision. One major component of survey error is nonsampling error, which includes errors of coverage, response and nonreporting. Since the survey panel is not a probability sample, estimates of sampling error cannot be calculated. Further details on survey design, methodology, and data limitations are contained in our most recent annual benchmark publication, Current Industrial Reports: M3-3(07), "Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders: 2004-2007."

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> The Capital Goods Industries include Nondefense: small arms and ordnance; farm machinery and equipment; construction machinery; mining, oil, and gas field machinery; industrial machinery; vending laundry, and other machinery; photographic equipment; metalworking machinery; turbines and generators; other power transmission equipment; pumps and compressors; material handling equipment; all other machinery; electronic computers; computer storage devices; other computer peripheral equipment; communications equipment; search and navigation equipment; electromedical, measuring, and control instruments; electrical equipment; other electrical equipment, appliances, and components; heavy duty trucks; aircraft; railroad rolling stock; ships and boats; office and institutional furniture; and medical equipment and supplies.

Defense Capital Goods include: small arms and ordnance, communications equipment, aircraft; missiles, space vehicles, and parts, ships and boats, and search and navigation equipmen

Data on new and unfilled orders are not available for the semiconductor industry. Estimates and percent changes for new orders and unfilled orders exclude semiconductor industry data. Inventories for semiconductor industry data are included in computers and electronic products and total durable goods industries, but are not shown separately.

## **Survey Description**

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,300 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 59 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 61 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,300 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,300 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication.

#### BENCHMARK NOTICE

Revised historical data for Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders will be issued on May 14, 2010. These revisions reflect:

- benchmarking the shipments and inventory data to the 2007 Economic Census and the 2008 Annual Survey of Manufactures (ASM) data;
- o adjusting new orders and order backlog to be consistent with the benchmarked shipments and inventory data:
- correcting monthly data for late receipts, reclassifications of reported data, and revisions to previously reported data; and
- o updating the seasonal adjustment factors for all series.

As of the Benchmark release, shipments for the semiconductor industry will no longer be shown separately, but will be included in the computers and electronic products, and all other applicable aggregate totals.
